#### **INCARNATION**

- And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us
- > and we beheld His glory)
- the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,
- > full of (grace) and (truth.)

## John 1:1-3; 14 Summary

Once the identity of the WORD is grasped and the incarnation is seen as a monumental act of revelation, then His GLORY is revealed.

#### John 1:14 - Jesus is the Tabernacle

<sup>14</sup> And the Word became flesh

God became human in Jesus Christ

and dwelt among us,

Jesus Himself was the Tabernacle of God

and we beheld His glory,...

The tabernacle or Temple, was where the Glory of God was.

• "Dwelt" = Tabernacle or the "tent of meeting" of Ex.33:11 (Ex. 33:7-34:35) where God dwelt & met Moses to speak to him.

## **Tabernacle Scriptures**

Ex. 25:8 "And let them make Me a sanctuary, that I may dwell among them."

Joel 3:17 "So you shall know that I am the LORD your God, Dwelling in Zion My holy mountain. Then Jerusalem shall be holy, And no aliens shall ever pass through her again."

**Zech. 2:10** "Sing and rejoice, O daughter of Zion! For behold, I am coming and I will dwell in your midst," says the LORD."

Ezekiel 37:27-28 <sup>27</sup> My tabernacle also shall be with them; indeed I will be their God, and they shall be My people. <sup>28</sup> The nations also will know that I, the LORD, sanctify Israel, when My sanctuary is in their midst forevermore."

Rev. 21:22-23 <sup>22</sup> But I saw no temple in it, for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. <sup>23</sup> The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it. The Lamb *is* its light.

## **Tabernacle – Deep Dive**


- John 1:14 "dwelt" = tabernacle Jesus was a tabernacle!
- Tabernacle was God's dwelling place with men.
  - Temporary
  - Center of the camp
  - Place the Law was preserved
  - Place of sacrifice
  - Where priests fed
  - Place of worship

#### Jesus Christ is the Tabernacle

**Temple** of God, but He was the **High Priest** and the Final Temple **Sacrifice**!

Mercy Seat = Propitiation for Sin

Arc of the Covenant = our sin bearer

#### John 1:14 - THE GLORY OF GOD

- "Dwelt" also means "residence" and refers to the "Glory of God" who made Himself present in the tabernacle and the temple.
- The bright cloud of the presence of God settled on the tabernacle, and the glory of the Lord filled it. (Ex. 24:16; 40:34; 1 Kings 8:10-11). Also shown in a pillar of smoke and fire (Exodus 13:21-22) and as a burning bush (Ex. 3:2)
- V.14 literally means Jesus Christ who is God, "tabernacled" among us.
- Jesus spoke about "the temple of his body" John 2:19, 21
- Paul taught that because we are united to the risen
   Messiah "we are the temple of the living God" 2 Cor. 6:16

## Glory of God - in the Temple

Ex. 24:16 <sup>16</sup> Now the glory of the LORD rested on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it six days. And on the seventh day He called to Moses out of the midst of the cloud.

Ex. 40:34 <sup>34</sup> Then the cloud covered the tabernacle of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle.

1 Kings 8:10-11 <sup>10</sup> And it came to pass, when the priests came out of the holy *place*, that the **cloud filled the house of the LORD**, <sup>11</sup> so that the priests could not continue ministering because of the cloud; for the glory of the LORD filled the house of the LORD.

John 2:19, 21 <sup>19</sup> Jesus answered and said..., "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up... <sup>21</sup> But He was speaking of the temple of His body."

**2 Cor.** 6:16 <sup>16</sup> And what agreement has the temple of God with idols? For you are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will dwell in them And walk among them. I will be their God, And they shall be My people."

#### John 1:14 - SHEKINAH GLORY

- "Shekinah" glory was the visible manifestation of God and means the "dwelling" of the divine presence of God this is Jesus in the Flesh.
- What the Shekinah glory was to the tabernacle and temple (cloud), the Spirit is to the "holy temple" (Eph. 2:21), the church, and to the temple which is the believer's body (1 Cor. 3:16; 6:19).
- Jesus' glory was also shown in His signs (2:11; 11:4; 11:40) and He was supremely glorified in His death (John 7:39; 12:16, 23; 13:31-32),
- The beauty of His presence and Spirit often thought of as the image of brilliant light. (Isaiah 60:1-3; Rev. 21:22-25).
- Connected with His holiness and weightiness, that is, His significance (Lev. 10:1-3)

## "Shekinah" Glory = Holy Spirit Now

**Eph. 2:21** <sup>21</sup> in whom the whole building, being fitted together, grows into a **holy temple** in the Lord,

1 Cor. 3:16 16 Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?

Isaiah 60:1-3 Arise, shine; For your light has come!

And the glory of the LORD is risen upon you.

<sup>2</sup> For behold, the darkness shall cover the earth,

And deep darkness the people; But the LORD will arise over you, And His glory will be seen upon you.

<sup>3</sup> The Gentiles shall come to your light, And kings to the brightness of your rising.

#### THE GLORY OF GOD = The LAW

- The character of God as represented in the 10 Commandments (Rom. 3:23; 1 John 3:4, Ex. 33:18-34:7).
- The Law reflects the Glory of God!
- Eccl. 12:13-14 "Fear God and keep His commandments", this glorifies God & is the ultimate conclusion of Ecclesiastes.

## The Law = The Glory of God

(The 10 Commandments is the Law)

#### **Romans 3:23**

"for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,"

#### 1 John 3:4

"Whoever commits sin also commits lawlessness, and sin is lawlessness."

Sin is what makes us fall short of the glory of God.

Sin is "Lawlessness"

Therefore, 10 Commandments, or The Law = The Glory of God!

## **Glory of God – Other Aspects**

- God reveals His glory to man through creation
  - Psalm 19:1 "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands."
- Man, riches and idols do not deserve any glory
  - Is. 42:8 8 I am the LORD, that is My name; And My glory I will not give to another, Nor My praise to carved images.
  - Rom 1:22-25 <sup>22</sup> Professing to be wise, they became fools, <sup>23</sup> and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man—and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things.

## Jesus Display's God's Glory

John 2:11 <sup>11</sup> This beginning of signs Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and manifested His glory; and His disciples believed in Him.

John 11:4 4 ... He said, "This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

John 11:40 <sup>40</sup> Jesus said to her, "Did I not say to you that if you would believe you would see the glory of God?"

John 7:39 39 But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet *given*, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

John 12:16 <sup>16</sup> His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified,...

John 12:23 <sup>23</sup> But Jesus answered them, saying, "The hour has come that the Son of Man should be glorified.

John 13:31-32 <sup>31</sup> So, when he had gone out, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man is glorified, and God is glorified in Him. <sup>32</sup> If God is glorified in Him, God will also glorify Him in Himself, and glorify Him immediately.

## Purpose of Life = GLORIFY GOD

 Man was created for God's glory (Isaiah 43:7) & can be seen in things such as our love, relationships, music, work, etc. —We are the vessels which "contain" His glory (2 Cor. 4:7).

#### • Isaiah 43:7

- Everyone who is called by My name, Whom I have created for My glory;
   I have formed him, yes, I have made him."
- Eccl. 12:13-14 "Fear God and keep His commandments"
  - This glorifies God & is the ultimate conclusion of Ecclesiastes. Sin is the opposite of glorifying God.
- To Glorify God means to give glory to Him as Lord in everything we do through praise, worship, thanksgiving, obedience & submission.
- To Glorify God means to Follow Jesus and Obey His Commands

## John 1:14 – GRACE & TRUTH

14 ...the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

- Grace and truth are what describe the glory of God and is kindness, love, mercy and compassion, but also His justice.
- Ex. 34:5-7
  - <sup>5</sup> Now the Lord descended in the cloud and stood with him there, and proclaimed the name of the Lord. <sup>6</sup> And the Lord passed before him and proclaimed, "The Lord, the Lord God, merciful and gracious longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth,"
  - <sup>7</sup> keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, by no means clearing the guilty...
- The glory revealed to Moses (Ex. 33:18-19; 34:5-7) is the same glory as Jesus revealed, but it was not perceived by everyone...only by those who put their faith in Him.

## John 1:14, 17 – GRACE & TRUTH

14 ...the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

<sup>17</sup> For the law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ

- GRACE Under grace, God gives righteousness as a free gift to those who trust in Jesus. ("justified by grace" Titus 3:4-7)
- LAW In contrast with the LAW (connected to Moses and works), under which the God demands righteousness from us. Blessings accompany obedience.
- There was always grace before Christ (sacrifices, faith saved in anticipation of the Cross), but Christ's atoning sacrifice on the Cross began a new dispensation where Grace reigns in its fulness (Rom. 5:21).
