
- The Bible is no mere book, but a Living Creature, with a power that conquers all that oppose it. Napoleon

Old Testament

(39 Books, 2000 BC-400BC)

Mal 3:1 – Messenger will come to prepare the way for Messiah



New Testament

(27 Books, before 100 AD)

Mark 1:3- John the Baptist
Came preaching
repentance & about the
coming Christ

- The entire Bible has one great theme, the Person and work of the Lord Jesus Christ, who is God revealed in the flesh (1 Timothy 3:16), and whose sacrificial death and resurrection to save mankind from judgement and the penalty of sin, constitutes the Gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-4).
- Over the period of 2,000 years before Jesus, the OT prophets promised a Rescuer, the Christ, the Anointed Messiah who would save the world from the slavery of sin and final judgement.
- In the OT, sin was atoned for (satisfied God) by animal sacrifices, but the final eternal redemptive act of God to save mankind would be provided by the shed blood of the sinless "Lamb of God" which would be Christ. Salvation is by Faith in the Crucified Christ.
- There are over 300 prophesies of Christ's first coming in the OT that were fulfilled, from Genesis 3:15 to Malachi 4:5, (and over 1,800 prophesies on His Second Coming which are still to be fulfilled!).
- Christ was prophesied as <u>both</u> a <u>Royal & Priestly Messiah</u> from the line of David (Psalm 110:1; Jer. 33:14-16) and as a <u>Suffering Servant</u>. (Isaiah 53).

God's Dispensations of Time

In-break of the Kingdom "the time is fulfilled" Mark 1:15

The End of the Age;

Day of the Lord,

Second Coming

The Age to Come,

Age of the Law

(Period from Moses to Pentecost)

Time of sin & longing for the fulness of the Spirit; temple worship; prophets; overlap with Church Age

Church Age

(Dispensation of the Holy Spirit or of Grace – New Covenant) 1st the Suffering & the Cross

Holy Spirit permanently indwells believers, and are justified by Faith in Jesus Christ

1st – Evangelization of Gentiles (Acts 15:14)

Millennial Age

(after rapture, The Second Coming of Christ)

2nd the Glory & the Throne

Jesus will rule as King on physical earth on David's throne. Satan will no longer be ruler, 1,000 years

2nd – Restoration of Israel

2500 years from Adam to Moses

1500 years from Moses to Jesus

2,000 years from Jesus to the Current Time

2,000 years = 2 days

1,000 years reign of Jesus Christ after His return – then Eternity in Heaven – Rev. 21

1,000 years = 1 days

4,000 years = 4 days

7 days is God's Perfect Number (creation)

Romans

 "This letter is truly the most important piece in the New Testament. It is purest Gospel. It is well worth a Christian's while not only to memorize it word for word but also to occupy himself with it daily, as though it were the daily bread of the soul. Romans Overview

- Roman's is considered by many to be the greatest document in human history.
- The most systematic description of God's plan and purpose for saving sinners.
- Romans is the greatest doctrinal book of the Gospel of Christ and has been the most influential book in church history (Augustine, Luther, Wesley, Bunyan).
- Emphasis on Christian doctrine & theology such as: sin, salvation, grace, faith, righteousness, justification, sanctification, redemption, death, resurrection, eschatology, and divine sovereignty.
- Widespread use of OT quotations, more than in all the other Pauline letters combined. 61 direct quotations from 14 different OT books. (Psalms and Isaiah)
- Key Words Used: God 154 times; Law 77 times; Christ 66 times; Sin 45 times; Lord 44 times; Faith 40 times; Holy Spirit 27 times (92 times in the entire NT)
- Deep concern for Israel. Paul writes about its present status, its relationship to the Gentiles, and its final salvation.
- Romans will captivate the greatest genius, yet bring tears to the humblest soul.

Romans Overview

- Apostle Paul, a Jew from Tarsus, a Pharisee under Gamaliel, chosen by God as the Apostle to the Gentiles.
- Written between **AD 55-58** from Corinth on 3rd Missionary Journey (before the first Gospel of Mark, written after 60AD).
- Rome was the capital of the Roman Empire & the World, and therefore the most strategic city for Christian missions. Nero (A.D. 54–68) was reigning as emperor.
- Paul's main theology is "Justification (to be declared righteous)
 by faith" that the sinner is declared righteous before God
 through simple faith in Jesus Christ, not by the works of the law
 of Moses.
- Explains the utter sinfulness of man and the adequacy of the completed work of Christ to save by grace through faith all who come to God by Him.

Scripture – Romans 1:1-4

- ¹ Paul, a bondservant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, separated to the gospel of God
- ² which He promised before through His prophets in the Holy Scriptures,
- ³ concerning His Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who was born of the seed of David according to the flesh,
- ⁴ and declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead.

Romans 1:1 Introduction

- Opening idea ("Gospel") is stated, developed and returned to in conclusion. V1. is very Significant & echoes themes in Isaiah
 - Bondservant Slave of Lord Jesus, who was purchased by blood of Christ - Redemption- 3:24; 6:16-23 (Abraham, Moses, Joshua)
 - Called Chosen/Predestined (Is. 41:9; 42:6; 43:1; 49:1-13)
 - Apostle Sent out with authority (Is. 6:8 "Send me.")-privilege
 - Separated in OT God set apart His chosen people; Gal 1:15
 - Gospel of God The good news is <u>from</u> God (explained in v. 2-4)
- Big Themes Paul, the apostle to the Gentiles, was divinely chosen to preach the gospel of God in Christ, and is rooted in OT.

Romans 1:2

Gospel is Promised in the OT

- Gospel of God is fulfillment of Old Testament Prophesies, (beginning with Gen. 12:1-3 Abrahamic Covenant to bless His descendants).
- Shows that God keeps His promises
- Written by the Prophets in the Holy Scriptures
 - Prophets spoke the Word of God
 - Holy Scriptures "Holy" means unique and precious because they are spoken by God.
- Big Theme The Gospel of God was planned and predicted long ago by the prophets.

Romans 1:3-4

Gospel is all about Jesus Christ

- "concerning His Son...descended from David...in Power...Spirit
 of holiness and resurrection from the dead...Jesus Christ our
 Lord."
- Son means Jesus Christ is God and has always existed
- Descendant of David Davidic Covenant: 1 Chronicles 17:11–14; Jer. 23:5; Isaiah 11:10
- Power not political power, but Power over Sin & Death!
- Spirit of Holiness Romans 8:11 Christ was raised from the dead by the Holy Spirit, who will also raise believers.
- Lord means that Jesus is God and is worthy of being committed to, submitted to and <u>obeyed</u> out of love for Him.

Romans 1:5 Grace & Apostleship

- Grace is the heart of the Gospel.
- Grace is undeserved mercy, a free "gift" to the recipient, but costs something of the giver.
- The wonder of God's Love and Grace can only be understood in light of God's justice and wrath.
- You need to know who you were before Christ....A Sinner (Rom. 3:23), judged guilty of breaking God's Holy laws and deserving of death (Rom. 6:23).
- Ephesians 2:8 "For by grace are you saved, through faith, and that not of yourselves." (Rom. 3:22-24)
- We don't deserve God's grace, but Rom. 5:8 says "but God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Romans 1:5 (Rom. 16:26) Obedience to the Faith

- Evidence of salvation is faith that results in a life of obedience to God's Word.
- To fulfill the Great Commission & obey His Commands.
- To sides of the same Salvation coin Faith + Obedience (song "Trust & Obey").
- Obedience requires you to recognize Christ not only as Saviour, but also as the Lord of your life (Rom. 10:9-10; Acts 2:36; Matthew 7:22-27).

Romans 1:8-15 - Paul's Motives

- 1. Thankful heart for others
- 2. Concerned for believers (prayed for them)
- 3. Obedient to God's will (advancement of kingdom)
- **4. Loving** Spirit wants to give them spiritual gifts
- 5. Humble Spirit The great Paul wants encouragement from these beginners
- **6. Desire to be Fruitful** new converts & discipleship
- 7. **Debtor** to God & Gentiles Felt obligation to save the lost he has the cure for to save from the disease of sin
- 8. Eager to Boldly Preach the Gospel (and unashamed)

Romans 1:16-17 - Gospel of Christ

- Unashamed even though it is foolishness and offensive to the unsaved (Jews were ashamed; Mark 8:38). Why would people/we be ashamed?
- Power of God only God can forgive sin "Dynamite"
- Salvation rescue from penalty & power of sin, new nature & eternal life
- **Faith** "from faith to faith" a continuous Trusting in Christ; like a marriage; not just a one-time event;
- **Righteousness** God imputes His righteousness to those who Trust in His Son, as their Lord & Saviour
- The Just Shall Live by Faith Habakkuk 2:4

What is the Gospel?

A means of forgiveness of sin?

Forgiveness is the cause

 A means of getting to heaven and avoiding hell?

Eternal Life is the result

• How to Live a morally good life and be happy? Lifestyle is the result

The Gospel of Christ = Salvation Message

- The Gospel is the Power of God unto Salvation
- Like a force of nature Supernatural Greek word for "power" is "DYNAMITE" – beyond man's power.
- Gospel is <u>not</u>: a code of ethics or morals or creeds or system of religion or just good advice.
- It's about Saving Your Soul (for eternity)— 1 Peter
 1:8-9
- Salvation is by Faith in Christ & Christ Crucified
- Only 1 Gospel 1 Gal:6-9

The Gospel – 2 Parts

1. Gospel of Grace – Salvation Message

• Good news of salvation & eternal life. Jesus died on the Cross for the sins of the world, He was raised from the dead, and all who believe in Him are saved from sin and its punishment (justified) and given the gift of eternal life. (1 Cor. 15:3-4, Rom. 6:23)

2. Gospel of the Kingdom

 The good news that Christ (the Son of David) is returning to set up the Kingdom of God on Earth. (Davidic covenant, 2 Samuel 7:16; Is. 9:6-7; Matt 9:35; 24:14).

What is the Gospel?

 Romans describes the Gospel primarily as a Salvation from Unrighteousness to Righteousness

 Therefore, The Gospel is all about receiving the gift of Eternal Life by attaining the Righteousness of God by faith in Christ.

The Gospel is the Righteousness of God Revealed

- What is Righteousness?
- Right Standing with God as measured by God's Holy standards.
- Perfectly obeying all of God's 613 laws and other commands given by Jesus. This is impossible for man to do on his own. If you break even one law, you have broken all of the laws (James..).
- Breaking any of God's laws is Sin. We cannot have any past sin and meet the Righteous Requirements of God.
- Since the Penalty of Sin is spiritual death, the only need for mankind is to have our sin problem solved so we can have Eternal Life.
- 2 Cor. 5:21 "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (the great exchange)

Salvation of God

- To be saved from sin and it's punishment, which is death & eternity in hell, and to receive forgiveness and eternal life with Jesus in Heaven.
- Salvation is by Grace through Faith in Jesus Christ, is a free gift and is without works (morality, religion and good works do not save)
- Includes all the redemptive acts of:
 - Justification
 - Redemption
 - Grace
 - Propitiation
 - Atonement

- Substitutionary
- Imputation
- Forgiveness
- Sanctification
- Glorification


3 Tenses

- Past Christians are saved from the guilt and penalty of sin
- Present Christians are saved from the power & dominion of sin
- Future Christians are saved from the presence of sin at the Lord's Return

Salvation = "repent and believe"

- Repentance for the unsaved person means a heartfelt, sorrowful recognition that you are a lost, helpless sinner who needs God's forgiveness. (a change in mind resulting in a change in lifestyle – "Have mercy on me, a sinner")
- Believe = Trust = Faith (total confidence in and dependence on Jesus)
 - that Jesus Christ is God and your saviour, and with faith, accept Him into your heart as your Lord with a desire to follow Him.
 - It's more than intellectual, even the demons "believed" and trembled, it must be from the heart and there must be a change in your life.
- Salvation When we do our part by Repenting & Believing, God does
 His part by providing us salvation, which is the forgiveness of sins and
 eternal life.
 - No effort required Just Trust (with a repentant heart)
 - But it does require Commitment like a marriage to a spouse where on the wedding day you trust your spouse to love and care for your needs for the rest of your life.
 - Repentance & Faith go together, because it's impossible to put your faith in Christ as your Lord & Saviour, without first changing your mind about who He is and what he has done.4
